

Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to welcome two new members of staff to our nursery team. Marie who will be working in the Toddler Den and Kim who will be based in the Preschool Study. They both bring with them experience of working in the industry and we are really looking forward to them being a part of our team.

The renovation work in the garden has now been completed and the nursery has an amazing outside garden space that the children can use and explore in all year round. We have some wonderful resources for the garden and there will be some great learning opportunities for the children to take part in. The Baby Snug

The children in Baby Snug have been exploring senses through painting using their whole bodies. They loved squishing the paint between their fingers and rubbing the paint onto their bodies and onto to the paper. We developed our mark making skills and are developing our vocabulary and our gross motor skills. The children shared these experiences with their key person, developing their bonds. We have also explored water trays, swishing the water around with our hands and fingers and using little cups and jugs to pick up and pour the water as well.

The children have also really enjoyed taking part in 'Baby Boogie' time in the Baby Snug, where they are able to move their bodies to some nursery rhymes. They have especially enjoyed exploring the sounds that the different instruments and toys make when shaken, tapped and rolled around the room.

Coninue at home

Give your little one a pan and wooden spoon and watch as they learn the different noises they can make by banging the two together.

The Toddler Den

The children in Toddler Den have shown a real interest in singing their favourite nursery rhymes and moving around to music using ribbons, scarves, and the parachute. This gives them opportunities to practise turn taking; choosing a song out of the song bag, and also their communication skills, practicing using their language when singing the songs.

Toddler Den have been really interested in talking about animals and creating areas for the animals to live. They have been cleaning the animals and creating their own animal faces, using their imagination to move around the room in different ways.

We have also been looking at fruit and vegetables, how they grow and what they look like when we cut inside them. The children have been able to practise their cutting using a knife and develop control by practising cutting up the different fruits and vegetables. Following on from the fruits and vegetables, we have read the 'Hungry Caterpillar' story, trying the food from the story to see if we liked it.

Continue at home

Let your little one help prepare meals and snacks at home - talk to them about what they are doing. Cooking is a great opportunity to develop all areas of learning.

The Pre-School Study

In the Preschool Study, the children have been introduced to our new class Red Panda called Rainbow. Rainbow has come all the way from China and is going to be a big part of our room. He wants to visit the children's houses and to play with them over the time away from nursery. We will be asking a different child each week to take Rainbow home with them. Rainbow has a diary that he keeps with him all the time of the places he has visited so please take some photos and write about what you have done. Leading on from Rainbow visiting, we started to talk about where different animals love around the world and the environment that thy need. We have looked at jungles and oceans and the differences that they have and need. We have created a recycling bin for preschool and looked at how when we recycle different things, they need to go in the correct bin.

Recipe of the Month

RECIPE NAME - CHICKEN FAJITAS

INGREDIENTS:

For the filling:

- 2 large chicken breasts thinly sliced (or a meat substitute)
- 1 red onion, thinly sliced
- 1 red pepper, thinly sliced 1/2 red onion, diced
- 1 red chilli, thinly sliced (optional)
- Handful grated cheese
- 1 heaped tbsp paprika
- 1tbsp ground coriander
- Pinch ground cumin
- · 2 medium garlic cloves,
- 4 tbsp olive oil
- · 1 lime, juiced

To serve

6 medium tortillas

For the salsa:

- · 1 cucumber peeled and diced
- · 250g tomatoes, seeded and diced
- 1 tbsp crushed fresh garlic
- 1 tspn lime juice
- · 1 tspn olive oil
- 1/2 tspn ground cumin
- 1/2 tspn ground black



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Heat oven to 200C/400F/gas mark 6.
- 2. Mix paprika, coriander, cumin, crushed garlic, olive oil, and lime juice together in a bowl.
- 3. Stir the sliced chicken breasts, red onion, red pepper, and optional chilli into the marinade.
- 4. Heat a griddle pan until smoking hot and add the marinated chicken.
- 5. Keep everything moving over the high heat until you get a nice charred effect. If your griddle pan is small, you can do this in two batches.
- 6.To check the chicken is cooked, cut into the thickest part of the chicken. If it is still red inside, then continue cooking
- 7. For the salsa, mix the diced tomato, onion, cucumber, then add the lime juice, minced garlic, cumin, and black pepper. Set aside.
- 8. Put the tortillas in the oven to heat up for a few minutes, and serve with the cooked chicken mixture, salsa, and grated cheese.
