The Baby Snug

Following on from the open day, the children in the Baby Snug have loved all things music! They have enjoyed reading new stories such as 'Farmyard Jamboree'. From this, we have created invitations for learning based on the story such as a farmyard sensory tray. In this tray the babies were able to explore different textures such as weetabix, shredded wheat, and flour. As well as this they enjoyed playing with different farm animals and learning about the sounds they make. Using a range of musical instruments, they all enjoyed singing 'Old MacDonald had a farm' we also used Makaton to support this.

The babies have shown a particular interest in the sand pit in the garden. As the sand pit is low, it enables the children to climb and sit in it. They love using the sand toys to create many different structures and shapes. The sandpit allows the children to play alongside their friends, supporting their personal, social, and emotional development.

The Toddler Den

Toddlers have enjoyed a range of different autumnal activities. We have explored conkers, their texture and used them to paint with. Toddlers have been curious about the environment around them. We have looked at the change in the trees and discussed why the leaves have fallen and changed colour. From this we have read a range of different books to support their learning. We loved reading "leaf man".

Many of our toddlers have been busy over the weekend picking pumpkins with their families. At nursery we have been discussing their different colours and shapes with the children and incorporated them into our role play area for the children to explore. The children enjoyed digging the middle of the pumpkins using a range of different handheld tools supporting their physical development.

The Toddler Den have welcomed new friends from the Baby Snug. We have made them feel very welcome and supported them with the routine. We have also been learning some words in Spanish to support one of our friends.

The Pre-School Study

October has been another great 'learning as we play' month with a variety of child led activities. Several children have recently been on a Gruffalo hunt which led to us to setting up a special invitation for learning tray. The activity encouraged language development as well as more complex story telling using the available aids set out. Another exciting book bag that the pre-school study enjoyed was 'Handa's Surprise'. The children were encouraged to remember the sequence of events as well as the large variety of animals and fruit grown around the world.

A great deal of creativity took place when the children made their own stickmen using all natural elements found in our adventure garden. Autumn allowed a large variety of leaves to fall for the children to gather up. An extension of this led to leaf printing and mark making in the garden.

Halloween has sparked imagination for all the children in our pre-school study. Children enjoyed dressing up as their favourite characters from, wizards to witches to the Gruffalo. The children wanted to create their own potion and lotions station using many different resources, they picked their own resources and created many magical spells.
